It has been our experience that greyhounds are gentle, sweet, sensitive, loving, affectionate, playful, and intelligent. Greyhounds are usually very "greytful" for being given a second chance at life, and you may very well end up with the best friend you've ever had.

We have worked in greyhound rescue for many years and have seen many happy endings, and unfortunately we have also seen a few sad ones. So, although we may seem a bit overprotective, we have only the best interest of the greyhound in mind.

Before signing this agreement, please know that greyhounds can live 10-14 years. This is a serious commitment you are making. Are you prepared to do so? Before answering, consider some of the following lifestyle changes that may affect your family such as moving, having children, the cost of properly caring for the dog, etc.

It's very traumatic for a dog to be abandoned by its family once it has settled into its new home, and pets should NEVER be considered dispensable. These dogs rely on us to place them into appropriate, loving, responsible homes.

- Yes No I understand that initial introductions to other animals need to be in a controlled situation with my greyhound muzzled, and that my greyhound will need to wear a muzzle until relationships with my other pets are established.
- Yes No I promise to keep a collar bearing Chinook Winds Greyhound Rescue Foundation, plus my own identification on the dog at all times. I also agree to inform Chinook Winds Greyhound Rescue Foundation if I move or when my dog passes on.
